## Introduction

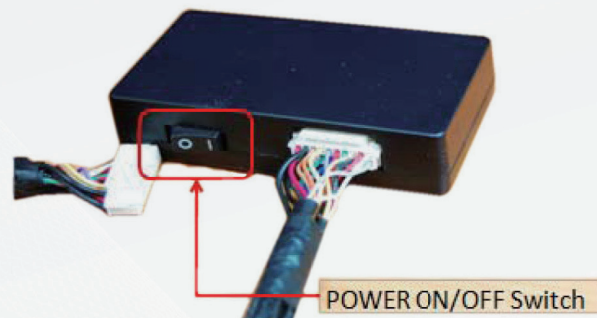
Ingenix is an advanced media platform capable of Lightning fast processing, picture in picture or split screen information display, Blue-tooth hands free calling and Blue-tooth music playback, GPS navigation and much more. Many of the features of Ingenix have never been available for in car use until now. Ingenix was designed to anchor your vehicle entertainment system along with the convenience of GPS navigation and the safety of a rear view camera. Ingenix offers everything you need and desire.

## READ BEFORE USE

Please make certain that all persons using this In-dash system carefully read these precautions and the following instructions fully.

- Read this manual carefully before using this system components. They contain instructions on how to use this product in a safe and active manner.
- This product is not a substitute for your personal judgment. Any route suggestions made by this navigation system may never supersede any local traffic regulations or your personal judgment and/or knowledge of safe driving practices . Do not follow route suggestions if the navigation system instructs you to perform an unsafe or illegal maneuver, places you in an unsafe situation, or routes you into an area which you consider unsafe.
- Glance at the screen only when necessary and safe to do so. If prolonged viewing of the screen is necessary, pull over in a safe and legal manner and location.

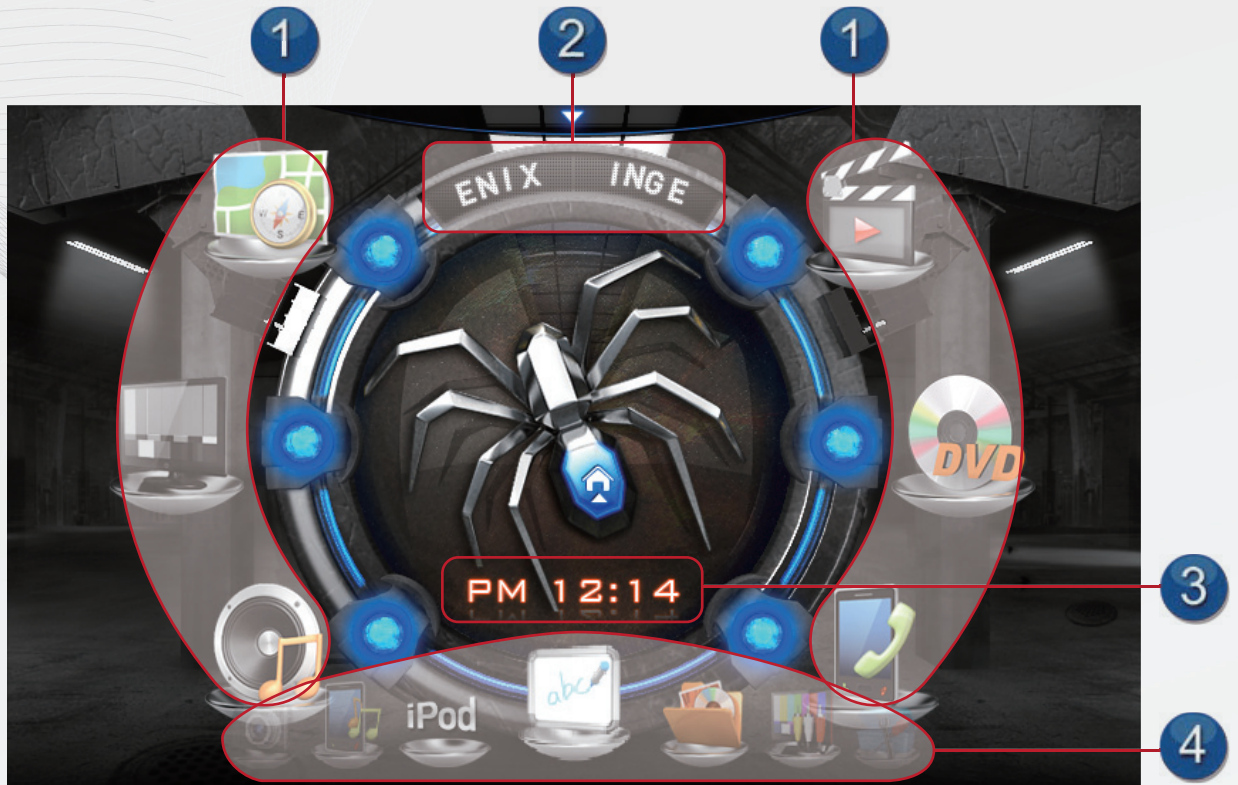

## Access to source unit options

The above picture displays the two main areas of the home menu. The lower section is the slider which can access any option of the radio with a simple swipe of your finger from left to right or right to left. To access the option it must be centered. Swipe the slider until you can see the option desired is in one of the five locations. If the desired option is not center simply touch the option and it will center. Once the icon is centered touch again to open the option.

## Creating your quick access links

The second main area of the home screen is the quick access links in the upper section. Source options from the slider can be moved to the quick access links for quicker access to often used sources. A total of six source options can be placed in the quick access links. Follow steps below to add source options to the quick access links. The option from one section will always switch places. Ex. If Blue-tooth music is moved from the slider to the quick access links whatever option the Blue-tooth music source replaces will be moved to the slider where Blue-tooth music was located.

- To move source options to quick access links swipe the slider with your finger either left or right to locate the desired source option.
- With the option visible in any of the five locations on the slider press and hold the option with your finger and slide it up to the quick access location desired.
- Repeat this with all six quick access links to create your list.
- This can be changed at anytime in the future following the same steps.

## Marquee banner

The Marquee banner can be customized to display any statement.

Access to source unit options

- Touch the Marquee banner to access the keyboard.
- Type the desired statement then press the enter key.
- You can also change the color of the text on the Marquee to Pink, Orange, or Emerald.

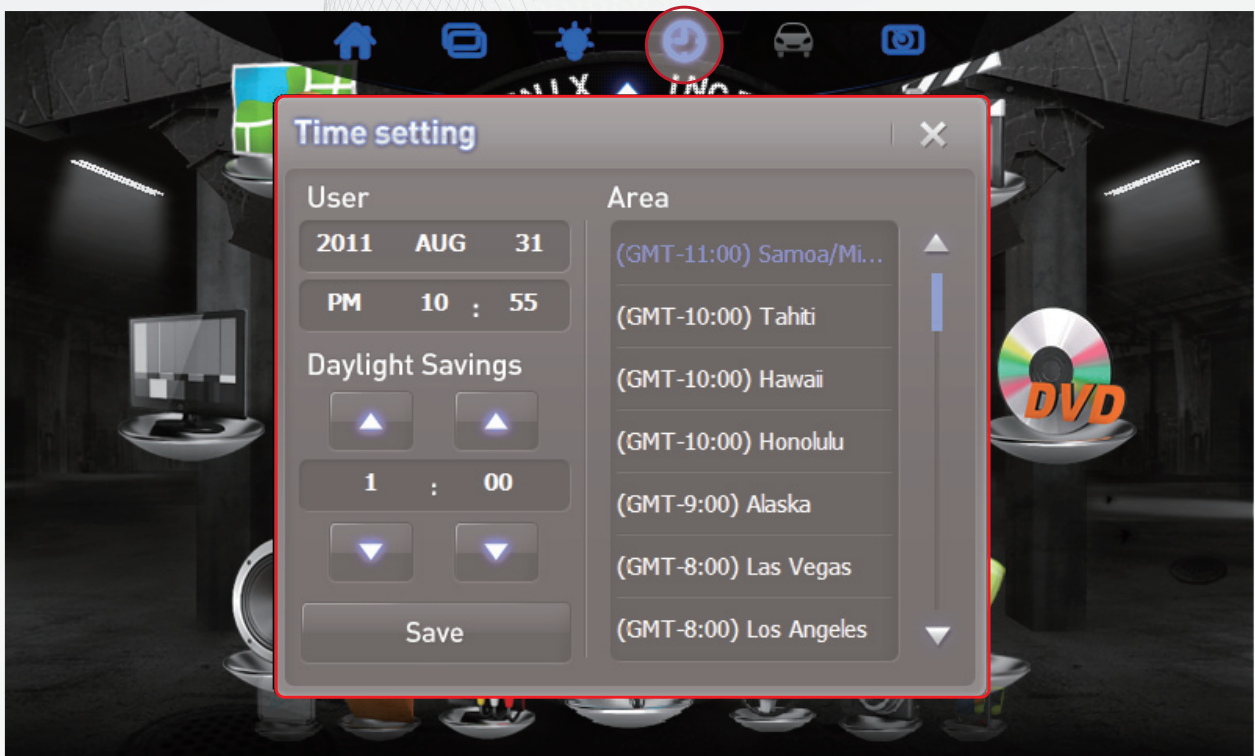

- The clock settings button will open the clock settings menu



- The trip center button will display OEM information including clock, multi disc changer, CD, AM/FM tuner information, and control information.

The sequence of searching is State-City-Street-House Number As you begin to input the State, City, Road or Street name, Ingenix will automatically prompt you with all possible matches . You have the option to select the search full view or keyboard anytime the icons are shown in the upper right side of the screen. Search full view will display many more matching names in place of the keyboard on the screen. Pressing the keyboard option will display the search keyboard.

Select the state by typing the first few letters of the name of the state. Ingenix will begin to shows tates matching the spelling. You can then directly select the desired state or type out the full name of the state before selecting. If you would like to you can search by "All states".

Next select the second white "City" option and use the keyboard displayed to type in the name of city.

Continue the same procedure for Street and House No (number).

If after you enter the name of Street, House Number, or Intersection you find an error you can correct the mistake by selecting the section containing the incorrect information. For example if the house number is incorrect you can select the "House No." information box and enter the correct number.

Final Step

Once you have entered your information you can now select "Calculate". Ingenix will then calculate a route.


Once the calculation is complete you can either select "GO" to start navigation directions, "Summary" to display information on your route (Distance to your destination, estimated time of arrival and your turn by turn guidance.), or "Route option" to change the parameters of the route by the item.

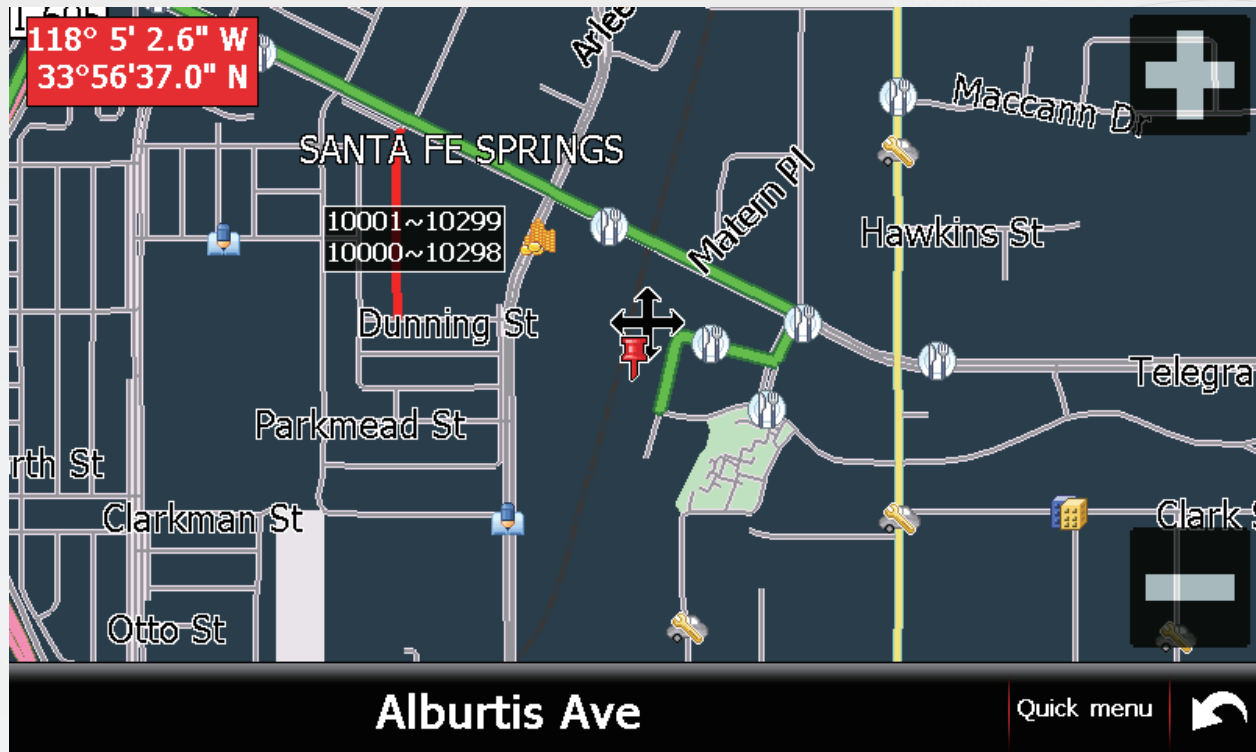
## Find by map



"Find by map" menu allows you to select a destination by simply pressing any area on the map.

You can create a route to a location by viewing the map and selecting a road or place with your finger.

## Blue-tooth

BLUE-TOOTH is a wireless technology allowing communication between a mobile device or personal computer over short distances. This enables a hands-free call between BLUE-TOOTH compatible devices.

How to connect to a BLUE-TOOTH compatible device (Pairing)

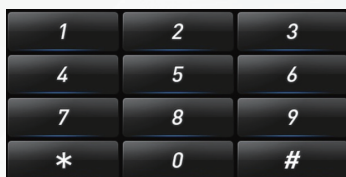

- Some mobile devices may require you transfer contact data manually. This is sometimes called "force" or "push". Consult your mobile device's operation manual for more information.
- Searching through contacts on your Ingenix source unit is simple.
- Press the up or down arrow to search one contact at a time.
- You can also press the slider between the buttons to move through your contacts more quickly.

## Deleting a contact

Deleting a contact will delete the contact from the Ingenix Phonebook. It will not delete the contact from your phone. Place a check mark next to the selected contact/contact(s) to be deleted and press the delete button.

Note: Some blue-tooth enabled phones may cause noise through the system.

## Pull down menu in Blue-tooth Phone source

- While operating in the Blue-tooth phone source the Navi PIP button will switch to full screen Navigation when selected. Note: the Navi PIP button will not switch back to Blue-tooth Phone when pressed from the Navigation source.

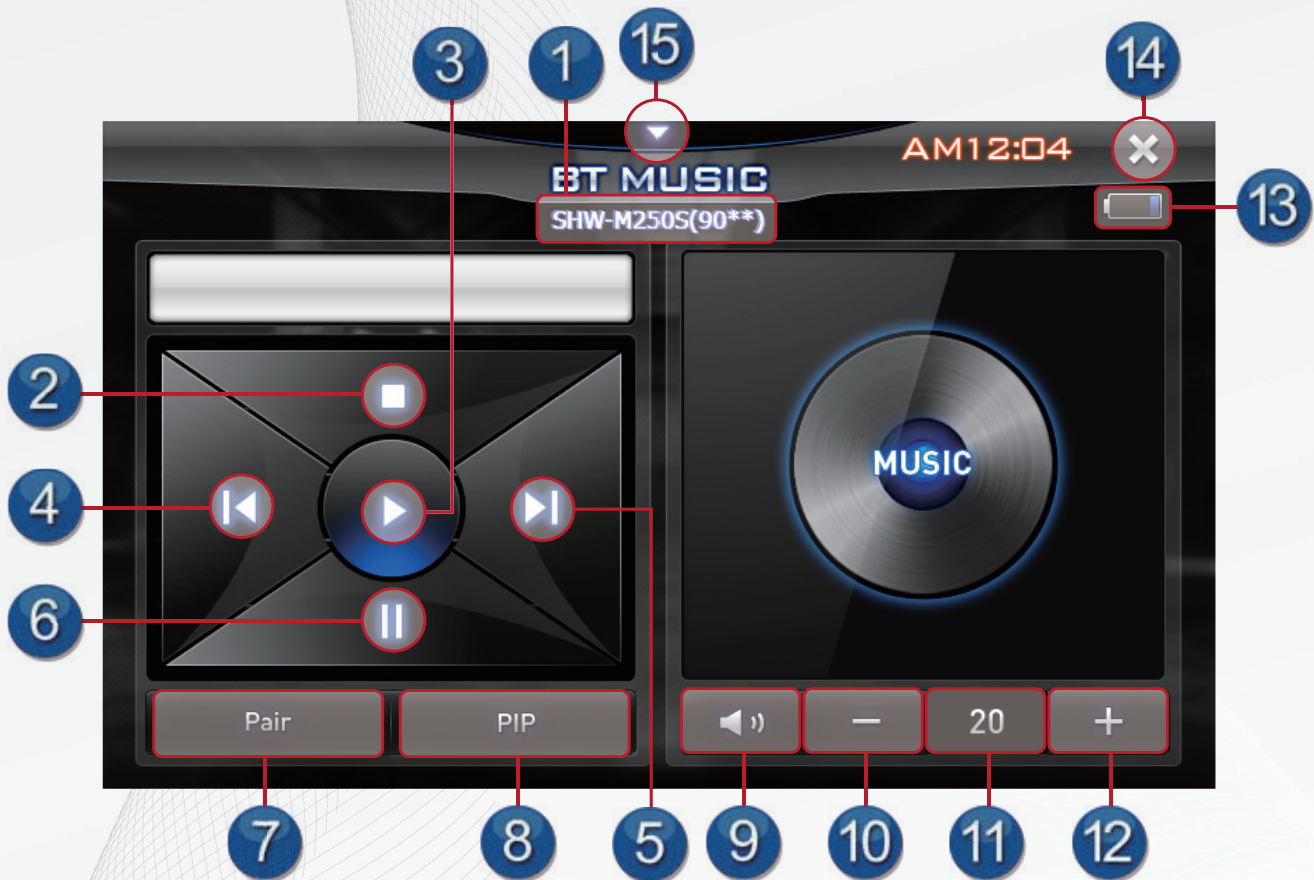

## Control Interface

## Main Control Interface

This section will help you get the most out of your Ingenix source unit's media playback. Take some time to familiarize yourself with buttons located on the main control interface. While the interface is quite intuitive it may take some time to understand all the options available at your fingertips.

- The main control interface is located on the bottom half of the screen.
- Pressing the large play button will pause playback. Pressing the button again will resume playback.
- Pressing "Next track" will skip ahead in your playlist.
- Pressing "Previous track" will skip back in your playlist.
- Press "stop button" to stop music playback.
- Pressing the "mute" button will mute the playback.
- Press the "mute" button again to resume the volume level. Pressing the volume up or down will also resume the volume level.
- Press the "volume up" button to increase volume and "volume down" button to decrease volume
- Volume level will be displayed between the volume up and down buttons.
- The playback button has three steps

 Repeat all will repeat all tracks

 Repeat will repeat the current track

 Random will randomly select tracks from your playlist to playback

- Pressing the "File manager" button will access the file manager. see the section labeled "Creating and accessing a playlist" below.
- Press the playlist button to access your current playlist. In this menu you can directly skip to a song in your playlist for playback. Touch the up or down buttons to move through your playlist. You can also touch the slider to move through your playlist faster. Press the "X" on the upper right side to exit the playlist.

## Creating and accessing a playlist

- To create a playlist for listen you must first access the files you wish to add.
- Press the "File search" button.
- Select files in the folder to create your playlist.
- Highlighted files will be included in the playlist.
- You can also press "Select all" to select all files in the folder.
- To save music to a playlist all songs must be in the same folder.
- Files can be moved to different folders to allow for larger playlists.

## Equalizer

- The EQ icon will access the equalizer options. There are ten Equalizer presets as well as two user presets
- Press any desired Equalizer preset to adjust the different sound options.
- When finished press the X on the top right of the equalizer window to return to the music player.



## Equalizer user presets

- User presets can be set at any desired levels and will automatically save for future use.
- To set a user preset first select either "User 1" or "User 2" then adjust the equalizer band by pressing the level you desire. To increase the frequency press a higher point to decrease press a lower point.
- When finished press the X on the top right of the equalizer window to return to the music player.

## Main display

- The main display shows information about the media you are listening to.
- Song title and track number will be displayed at the top of the screen.
- Album art will be displayed in the center of the screen for the current, previous, and next track.
- Time status bar is located at the bottom of the main window.
- Time played will be displayed on the left and total track time is displayed on the right.
- Pressing the time status bar will allow for skipping to any point on the track.

## Secondary display

- The display at the bottom center of the screen can display one of two options at a time.
- Either the spectrum analyzer or file captions can be displayed.
- Spectrum analyzer will display a graph showing frequency responses from the music playing. Lower frequencies are to the left while higher frequencies are to the right.
- The Caption option is the second option which will display text information from the file currently
- playing if the file contains supported information. Ex: song title, artist etc.

## Display options

- It is possible to change the colors of both the spectrum analyzer and the Text of Captions.
- Press the "Music player color options" to access display options.
- The spectrum analyzer has three color options. Blue, Violet, and emerald.
- Caption text has five color options. Yellow, Blue, Red, Black, and White.
- Touch the button with current color list to cycle through the other color options.

## Pull down menu in the Music player source

- When the Music player source is started Ingenix will determine if Navigation is running.
- If Navigation is running the small Music player menu will display in the upper right hand side of the screen.
- This window will allow you to access the controls of your SD,USB, or hard drive device without leaving the navigation screen.
- Pressing the down arrow on the menu will enlarge the window and display full control over the Music Player functions.
- The PIP button in the small Music Player menu will run Music Player in full screen.
- While in the Music Player screen the Navigation PIP button will switch between the Music Player and navigation sources.
- Pressing the PIP button on the lower section of the Music Player source will switch to Navigation and display the small Music Player menu in the upper right hand side.
- All other pull down buttons have standard function as listed in the page 15.





## Video Player

### Starting the Video player

The first time the video player is started Ingenic will ask for a file to play.

- Select the file from the file access menu. First select the media the file is located on (SD, HDD, USB).
- Next select the folder the file is inside (if the file is not already viewable)
- Last select the file and press the Play button.

From that time on when the video player is selected Ingenic will play the file from the last position viewed.

Note : If the file is removed from the drive Ingenic will not play the file upon start up.

Press "A-B" once more for normal playback.

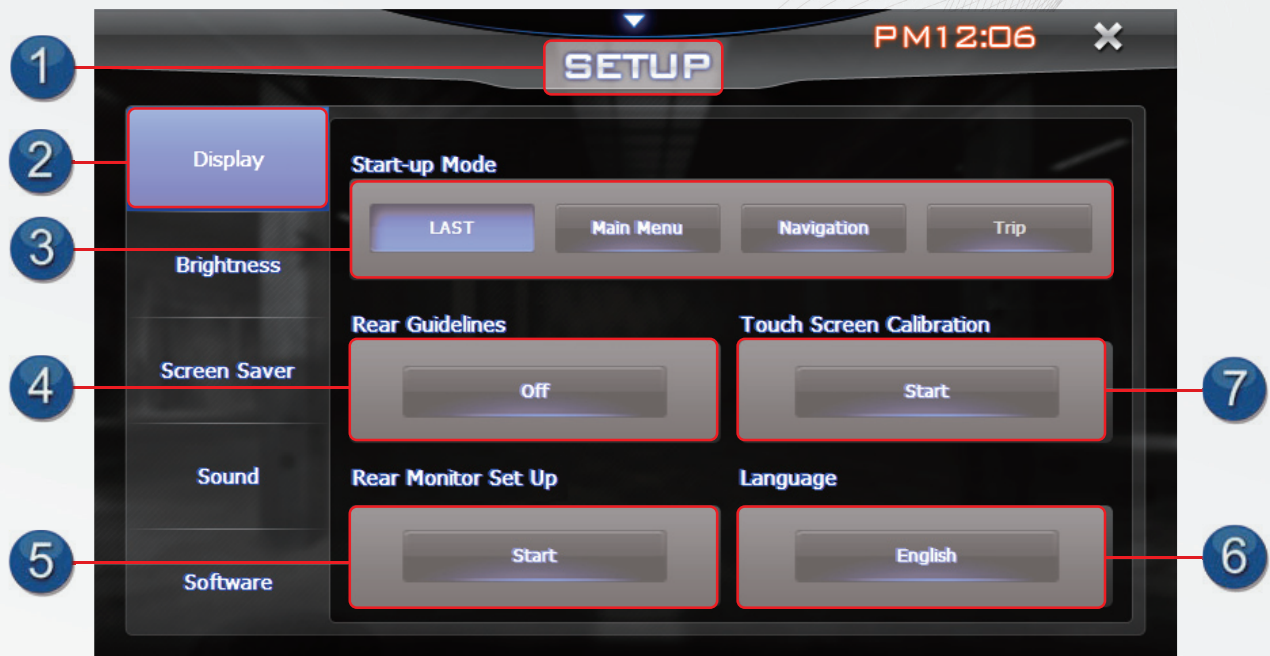

## Display

### Start-up Mode

- the display tab allows the user to choose which screen is loaded during system start up.

### Language

### Rear Monitor Set up

- Press the Rear Monitor Set up button to begin set up.

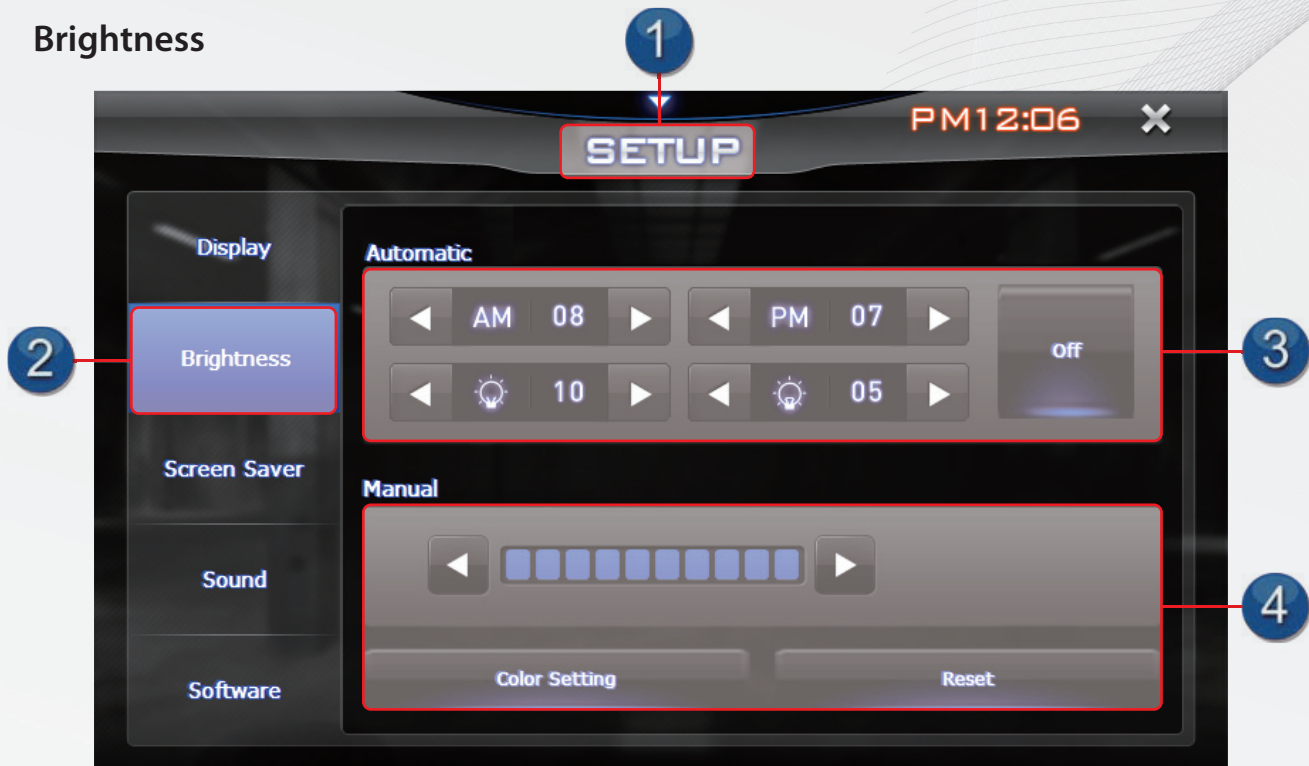

## Using an external DVD player with Ingenix

- When the DVD source is selected the main menu will display.
  - The "Up", "Down", "Left", and "Right" buttons will allow the user to navigate the DVD's menu
  - The "Enter" button will select the currently highlighted option of the DVD menu.
  - The "Menu" button will recall the DVD's menu at any time.
  - Pressing the button will increase volume
  - Pressing the button will decrease volume
  - Volume level is displayed between the volume controls .
  - Pressing the volume display number will mute audio
  - Pressing the power button will turn the DVD player off.
  - Pressing play/pause button will pause the video playback.
  - The mute icon will be displayed while muted pressing again will resume sound levels.
  - Pressing the play/pause button again will resume playback.
  - Pressing the stop button will stop playback
  - Pressing the skip ahead button will skip the current chapter and begin the next.
  - Pressing the skip back button will return to the beginning of the current chapter.
  - Pressing the skip back button two times will return the beginning of the previous chapter.
- Note: if playback is less than 3 seconds into the chapter pressing skip back will start the previous chapter.

Pressing the eject button will eject the Disc from the drive.

- Pressing the sub title button will shift though sub title options .
- Pressing the picture in picture button will access the GPS navigation.
- If GPS navigation is currently running the DVD playback will appear in the upper right side of the screen while GPS information will be displayed in the remainder of the screen.
- If GPS navigation is not currently running pressing the picture in picture button will start the GPS.
- For PIP controls see "Picture in Picture Controls" on the next page.

Note: DVD players that are not supported may not function through Ingenix as described.



## Picture in Picture controls

Ingenix has an advanced PIP(picture in picture) interface they may take some time to fully understand. Users who do not read this section may find commands given in regards to PIP locations and sizes may not return the desired effect.

- Press the PIP button from the video source you want to run with PIP.
- The location the screen is touched will direct the different responses.
- The shaded box indicates the touch location.
- Regardless of source, Ingenix PIP control are the same for all sources that support PIP. The chart below will display the response from specific commands.

While the PIP image is small and in the upper right. Touching the left side of the image will engage split screen view. Touching the right side of the image will engage the original source full screen.

Screen distortion may occur when changing PIP screen size. This is not a sign of any issue and should be considered normal operation.



While the PIP image is in split screen. Touching the left side of the image will engage full screen view. Touching the right side of the image will engage the small screen view.

## Troubleshooting

Some solutions are user serviceable while others require a professional installation center. Do not attempt performing any action unless you are confident that you understand the necessary steps involved. If you are unsure contact your local authorized dealer for support.
